In Makoni, most families make a living from agriculture, but the lack of rainfall and long dry seasons destroy their meagre harvests. There are few health stations and not enough trained medical staff. Clean water sources are hard to access and polluted water makes many children ill. Most of the schools are in need of renovation.

Living conditions must be improved for boys and girls here. In particular, clean, safe water must be made available to them.

With your help, we'll continue to support children and families here, empowering them to give their children a better future, especially the most vulnerable.

"Many children of my age drop out of school," explains Ruvimbo, 9 years old (right). "Since the death of my father, my mother has tried to take care of my education and that of my siblings. Unfortunately, my eldest brother dropped out of school in Grade 7 due to our financial problems. Sending us to school has been a struggle."

Ruvimbo's future changed for the better when her mother became involved in World Vision's income-generating poultry project.

"Now, she is able to pay my school fees and buy me school uniforms and stationery," she says. "We also have our own chicken-raising project at home and, when I have spare time, I assist with feeding the chicks."
